

Submit CNSA resolutions to this year's convention!

Every year, school chapters present a resolution at the CNSA Annual State Convention. One resolution is then selected by the House of Delegates to be sent to the National Student Nurses' Association (NSNSA) conference as the California state-sponsored resolution. This could be YOUR resolution!

Format: The resolution that CNSA submitted to the most recent NSNA conference is attached as an example of how to format a resolution. The parts of a resolution are:

- The Topic (max of 15 words);
- Who it is being submitted by (ex: school chapter, CNSA Board of Directors, CNSA committee, etc.);
- The author's name(s);
- Between 5-10 (total max of 300 words) "Whereas" clauses. The "Whereas" clauses are the data from your research articles that provide the specific rationales for your resolution;
- Between 3-5 Resolved clauses, which identify the recommended actions for the CNSA to perform related to your resolution.
