WHAT IS THE PRESIDENT?

 One appointed or elected person to preside over the CNSA school chapter

PRESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Maintain/Apply for Chapter's National Student Nursing Association (NSNA) Constituent Status
- Support the chapter's Board of Directors
- Conduct the Board of Directors and general membership meetings
- Student liaison with School of Nursing faculty
- Represent School Chapter CNSA as head delegate at state and national conventions
- Implement new programs and ways to give back to students

NSNA CONSTITUENT

- What is an NSNA constituent
 - It is any state association or school chapter in a state approved program preparing students for licensure as registered nurses that are recognized by NSNA as a current chapter
 - Requirements
 - Minimum 10 NSNA members prior to 8 weeks of the application deadline (February 11th, 2015)
 - Must submit application by April 11th, 2015
 - By submitting the application you agree to abide by specific areas of conformity by incorporating the list into your own bylaws

BOARD OF DIRECTOR SUPPORT

- As president, it will be your job to support current BODs and possible BODs in endeavors that they may chose to go down.
 - Example: you have a student CNSA member that is extremely passionate helping younger students understand the importance of nursing. The student wants to show others how they can start a nursing career. You would take this student and point them in the direction of starting a Break Through to Nursing position.

CONDUCT BOD AND MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

- As president it is your job to run these important meetings.
- You have the ability to make it as orderly or relaxed as possible.
 - For more orderly meetings look to use Robert's Rules_to run the meeting

STUDENT - FACULTY LIAISON

- As president it is your job to represent the students to the faculty
- You will work closely with your faculty advisors in order to advance the student organization
 - Some school's even have the president attend the faculty meetings and serve as the student and CNSA representative
- Also, make sure that BOD has monthly reports to faculty advisors on finances and event projections
 - Can include when event will be, what event will entail, and how much money will be spent on the event

STATE AND NATIONAL CONVENTIONS

- The president serves as head delegate for your chapter
- Encourages

 resolutions

- Students wear their white coats and take a vow of professionalism




NEW PROGRAM - TUTORING AND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
